Entry Times: Thursday 31 May 2018 from 8:00 to 10:30am.
Under NO circumstances will entries be accepted after judging has commenced at 11:00am.
Those with multiple entries (more than 6) are encouraged to submit their entry forms to the Show Secretary's Office prior to Tuesday 29 May 2018, so entry tickets can be processed in advance.

Judging: Commences 11:00am Thursday 31 May.
Judges and Stewards only permitted in the hall during judging. Judges decision is final.

Presentation: On disposable plates or covered boards with exhibitor's name underneath, and a tick or cross to indicate if entries are to be collected on Sunday 3 June 2018.

Collection of entries: Sunday 3 June 9:30-11:00am.
Exhibits not collected by such time will be disposed of. Please note: all care is taken with entries, however Maleny Show Society accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage incurred.

Entry Fee: \$1.00 per entry | **Junior Entry Fee:** Free (separate entry form required)

Prize Money: 1st \$10, 2nd \$6, 3rd \$4 (unless otherwise stated). 2nd and 3rd prizes awarded only if more than 2 entries | **Junior Prize Money:** 1st \$6, 2nd \$4, 3rd \$2. Except JCS.

Prize money must be collected on show days, Fri 1st & Sat 2nd June from the Show Secretary's Office.

SPECIAL PRIZES

- **A trophy** donated by **Bev Heading** will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the MOST POINTS in this section. An exhibitor must have at least SIX ENTRIES in this section to be eligible for the Special Prize.
- **Combined Prize** with SECTION Q SWEETS & PRESERVES:
A special **Perpetual Trophy**, donated by **Ian Aldred** in memory of wife, Beryle, will go to the exhibitor gaining the MOST POINTS in Sections P and Q combined.
- Points are awarded as follows:
1st = 5 pts, 2nd = 3 pts, 3rd = 1pt, and 1pt for every entry.

NB. Entries will be disqualified unless they adhere to what is required for each class | All exhibits in this section are to be the work of the exhibitor. All cakes and loaves will be cut or broken during judging | Fancy shape cake tins are not advisable.

COOKERY CLASSES

1. 5 Pikelets
2. 5 Jam Drops
3. 5 Anzac Biscuits
4. 5 Butterfly Cakes, decorated, papers allowed.
5. 5 biscotti biscuits
6. 5 Biscuits – Any other single variety.
7. 5 Slices- Any other single variety
8. 4 Slices Chocolate Brownie
9. 5 slices of Chewy Date, Fig & Ginger Slice. **Recipe supplied by CWA Country Kitchen for Healthy Food Choices.** Recipe to follow: 1 cup SR flour, 2/3 cup rolled oats, 1/3 cup cornflour, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/4 cup walnuts, 1/2 cup dried figs, 1 & 2/3 cup coconut. Mix these dry ingredients in bowl. Soften 2 cups chopped dates and 2 teaspoons ginger spice in 2 cups of milk for 3 mins in microwave, and add to dry ingredients. Bake in 18 x 28 cm slab tin for 20mins @ 180 degrees.

11. Cornflour Sponge - 1 mixture divided into 2 cake tins, filled with jam, not iced.
12. MEN'S ONLY – packet cake mix (chocolate), iced on top
13. Marble Cake in a bar tin

15. Ginger Cake-iced – bar tin
16. Cake – any other variety – can include gluten free. Include type of cake on entry form.

18. Orange Cake iced – Bar tin, iced on top only.
19. Coffee Cake iced
20. 4 Banana Muffins no papers
21. Sweet Pie or Tart – Any Variety
22. Boiled Fruit Cake.
23. Pumpkin Fruit Cake.
24. Plum Pudding - boiled in a cloth (Prizes: 1st \$14 2nd \$7, 3rd \$4)
25. Plum Pudding - steamed (Prizes: 1st \$14, 2nd \$7, 3rd \$4)
26. Rich Dark Fruit Cake Competition - 250gms butter, can include cherries and nuts - no icing. (Prizes: 1st \$25, 2nd \$15, 3rd \$10).

- JC4. 3 Gingerbread People.

PRIMARY SCHOOL SECTION – Prize cards and Ribbons only

- JC5. Decorated Chocolate Crackles – one per child on plates of five (5). Mark which School or Home School on entry sheet.

JUNIOR SECTION (B) – 12 to 16 years
